Coastal Community Foundation is a public grantmaking foundation dedicated to fostering philanthropy for the lasting good of the community. We serve donors and nonprofit organizations in Beaufort, Berkeley, Charleston, Colleton, Dorchester, Georgetown, Hampton, and Jasper Counties. The Community Foundation manages over \$150 million in assets held in nearly 570 individual funds, most of which are endowed. Donors create grantmaking funds for any charitable purpose including arts, education, environment, health, human needs, and neighborhood and community development. Over the past 37 years, Coastal Community Foundation has awarded more than \$100 million in grants to nonprofit organizations in the Lowcountry and beyond.

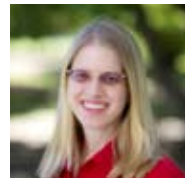

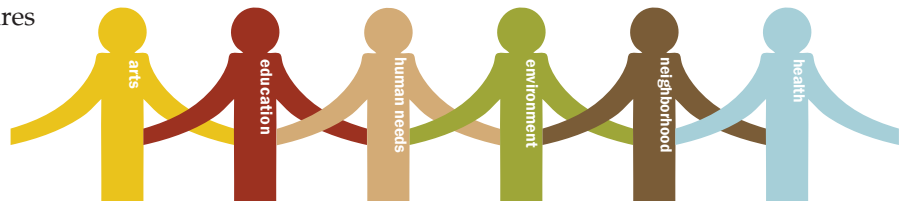

IF YOU CAN JOIN THEM, WHY WOULDN'T YOU?

Yes, there is a hefty investment upfront – a commitment of \$5,000 for 3 years and agreement to “roll up your sleeves” to do some serious nonprofit capacity-building. We know at Coastal Community Foundation that helping nonprofits operate more efficiently gives a rather large return on investment, so the initial investment doesn't seem so steep after all. In fact, joining this philanthropic group might be your best investment in 2011. (We're just sayin'.)

One of the best kept secrets of the Community Foundation is the quiet yet impactful work the Charleston Philanthropic Partners (CPP) is conducting with two nonprofit investees in the area of education: Charleston Volunteers for Literacy and Charleston Promise Neighborhood.

The mission is clear. The Partners work closely with selected nonprofit entities to enable them to achieve measurable outcomes better, faster, and in a more sustainable manner than would have been possible without CPP's involvement. Members apply their skills in direct support of these select nonprofits and, ultimately, deepen members' knowledge as well as broaden experience in philanthropy.

The Partnership provides an opportunity for highly committed donors to get involved in a meaningful way with a group of like-minded individuals. They

improve the sustainability of local nonprofit organizations so that the nonprofit can more effectively do its work. The tactics to do so involve an invitation-only selection process, careful screening of the nonprofits, and significant investments of both time and money, handled by the all-volunteer and quite impressive brain trust of Partners.

The Partners are currently recruiting individuals and/or couples to dive in; sleeves rolled up and ready to help. There are 12 partners operating under the astute leadership of Blackbaud CEO Marc Chardon and supported by Foundation Staff Edie Blakeslee. Social Venture Partnerships such as this one in Charleston, are global in nature with over 25 cities replicating the unique model.

Coastal Community Foundation manages funds for donors and provides grants to organizations that help our communities. Unlike other fund-management institutions, the Foundation boasts resources above and beyond dollars raised and granted—our expert and professional Staff.

Each Staff member has extensive knowledge of the community, the nonprofit organizations in the area, and what needs are most pressing. Staff members offer their expertise to nonprofit

organizations so that they can operate more effectively. Foundation Staff spends more than 1,000 hours annually working with individual nonprofits to ensure they can best meet needs in your community. 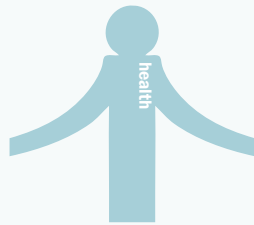

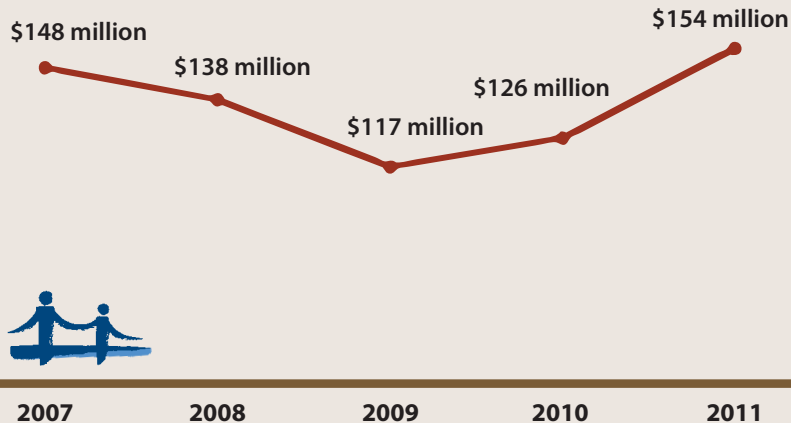

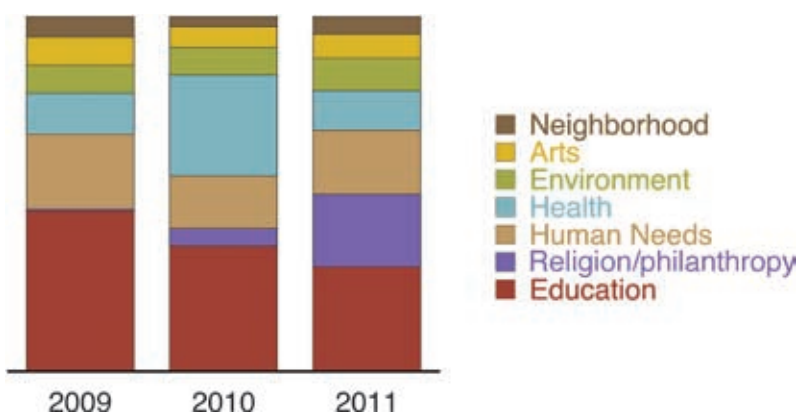

ASSETS UNDER MANAGEMENT

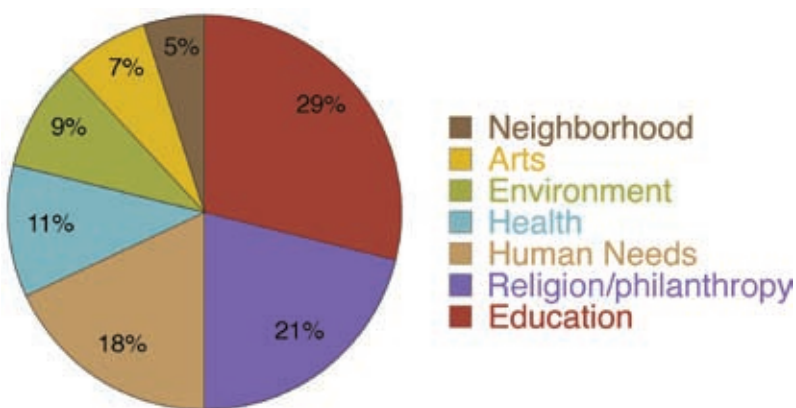
In 2011, assets under management increased 22.1% to an all-time high. Charitable gifts and positive investment returns contributed to the asset growth.



ALLOCATION OF GRANT FUNDING, 2009-2011

The allocation of grant funding changed recently.* In 2011, allocation of funding increased for arts, environment, human needs, neighborhood and most significantly for religion/philanthropy. Allocation of funding for health and education decreased.

*Grant funding consists of both donor advised and competitive awards.



TOTAL GRANTS, 2011

In 2011, total grants totaled \$9,897,331 in the form of 1,525 grant awards to 735 organizations. Education grants accounted for the largest group. Religious organizations and houses of worship coupled with philanthropic grants to other funders accounted for the second largest group. Human needs, health, environment, arts and neighborhood grants accounted for the remaining half.
